To the authors of the WFOT position paper on CBR,

Let me begin with expressing Japanese Association of Occupational Therapists' (JAOT) appreciation for the initiative of formulating a draft position paper on CBR on behalf of WFOT. Herewith, I sent you the response to this draft position paper of JAOT.

The draft position paper has been reviewed in several bodies of JAOT, including the board of directors and the international relations section that was composed of occupational therapists experienced in CBR as Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers of Japan International Cooperation Agency.
